P R E F A C E

The Federal-State Market News Service began collecting shipping point information and issuing daily market reports for the 1977-78 apple season on September 7, 1977.

This publication is a summary of the Appalachian District apple production, shipments, F.O.B. sales, selected terminal sales, and distribution records for the 1977 apple crop.

The summary was prepared by the Federal-State Market News office located in Martinsburg, West Virginia. This office was operated by the United States Department of Agriculture, Agricultural Marketing Service cooperating with the Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia State Departments of Agriculture.

Truck shipments on a weekly basis were obtained directly from shippers.

The Appalachian District is composed of the following areas:

Virginia - Roanoke and nearby points, northward including the Shenandoah Valley and the "rowing" areas immediately east of the Blue Ridge.

West Virginia - The four eastern counties of Jefferson, Berkeley, Morgan, and Hampshire.

Maryland - The three eastern counties of Allegheny, Washington and Frederick.

Pennsylvania - Primarily the southeastern counties of Franklin, Adams, York, Berks, and Lehigh.

SHIPMENTS & PRODUCTION: Production of Appalachian apples in 1977 increased about 26 percent above the light 1976 crop according to data collected by the Statistical Reporting Service of the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Total 1977 production was 1.05 billion pounds compared with 835 million pounds in 1976, and was about 13 percent below the average 1.2 billion pounds produced in the previous three year period (1973-75).

Pennsylvania was the leading producer in the Appalachian District with 430 million pounds, followed by Virginia with 330 million pounds, West Virginia with 220 million pounds and Maryland with 70 million pounds.

The main varieties ranked by volume of production were York Imperial 25.6 percent, Golden Delicious 21 percent, Delicious 18.5 percent, Stayman 13 percent and Rome Beauty 9.9 percent. Other major varieties included Jonathan, Winesap, McIntosh and Cortland in descending order of production.

Shipments from the Appalachian District during the reporting season totaled 4,362 40,000 pound net weight loads (1,000 40-pound cartons), compared with 2,991 loads in 1976-77 and 5,976 loads in the 1975-76 season.

GROWING CONDITIONS AND HARVESTING: After a very cold winter, warmer than normal temperatures forced early bud development. Some trees were injured by a freeze in late April which caused severe losses in some sections, especially in Virginia. Some scattered hail caused considerable damage in West Virginia in mid-June. Very dry weather prevailed over much of the growing season in much of the district with parts of Virginia suffering most.

Harvesting began late because of warm weather which delayed fruit coloring. September was very wet which caused frequent delays in harvesting. Because of the late start and excessive rain, advanced fruit maturing became a problem.

The wet weather continued into October but cooler than normal temperatures helped needed color development. Harvest was delayed by rain and cold at times but was completed about on schedule in most sections because of the light crop. Most growers finished picking by the first week of November.

LOCATION: The Appalachian District consists of portions of Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia which lie along the Eastern Appalachian Mountain Range. The most important producing areas within the district are the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, West Virginia's Eastern Panhandle, Western Maryland and South-eastern Pennsylvania.

PACKAGING AND MARKETING: The predominant pack was film bags packed in master containers. Most frequently used were 12-3 pound, 12-4 pound, 10-4 pound and 9-5 pound film bags. A few packers used film overwrapped trays. Practically all used traypack cartons and some used bulk containers of approximately one bushel. Some sales were made to chain stores in bulk bins.

F. O. B. prices for cartons containing 12-3 pound film bags graded U. S. Fancy or better, 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " and larger and for cartons traypack graded U. S. Combination Extra Fancy-Fancy, mostly 72-113 sizes were as follows:

REGULAR STORAGE:

Red Delicious 12-3 pound film bags opened at 5.50-6.00 until mid-October when prices increased to 6.00-6.50 and remained at that level until mid-November. Prices varied somewhat but gradually increased until mid-December ranging mostly 6.50-7.00. The market was higher the last three weeks of January at generally 7.00-7.50. Traypacked cartons ranged between 8.00 and 9.00 most of the season.

Golden Delicious 12-3 pound film bags were at 5.00-5.50 during the early part of the season then increased to 5.50-6.00 during mid-November to mid-December. After that there was a gradual decline in prices closing at mostly 5.00 in mid-February. Traypacks were mostly 7.50-8.00 during the first part of the season, and mostly 7.00-8.00 after early December.

Red Romes 12-3s opened at 5.50-6.00 but from mid-November to the end of the season, ranged mostly between 6.00 and 6.50. Traypack ranged 7.50-8.00 during the early season and mostly 7.00-8.00 after early December.

Red Stayman 12-3 pound film bags were generally in the 6.00-6.50 range through most of the season. Traypack cartons were 8.00-9.00 most of the season.

CONTROLLED ATMOSPHERE STORAGE: Marketing began during late January except some rooms were opened before certification to take advantage of favorable market conditions.

Red Delicious 12-3 pound bags opened at 8.00-8.25 and gradually increased during the season and closed at mostly 9.50 when market coverage was discontinued on April 10. Traypacks also showed a gradual increase from 9.50-10.00 early in the marketing season to 10.25-10.50 at the close.

Golden Delicious 12-3 pound bags were in the 6.50-7.00 range and traypack cartons were 8.50 throughout the season.

Red Rome 12-3s were generally 8.00 and traypacks were mostly 8.50-9.00.

Red Stayman 12-3s opened at 7.00-7.50 when many uncertified rooms were opened but were at 8.00 during most of the season. Traypack cartons were at 10.00 most of the season.

**APPLES COMMERCIAL CROP**  
(By Crop Reporting Board, SRS, USDA)

The Nation's 1977 commercial apple crop totaled 6.7 billion pounds utilized, a 5 percent increase from last year but 6 percent below the 1975 figure. In the East, 2.7 billion pounds were utilized 15 percent above a year earlier, and the Central States production rose 12 percent to 975.0 million pounds; both regions suffered from spring freeze damage to the 1976 crop. The Western States produced nearly 3.0 billion pounds, off 6 percent from 1976 and 2 percent less than in 1975. Washington's crop, the largest in the nation, slipped 7 percent from a year ago to 2.1 billion pounds.

York Imperials made the largest gain from 1976 with 40 percent more produced. Other varieties showing large increases were: Northern Spy and R. I. Greening, each up 26 percent; McIntosh, 25 percent; Stayman 19 percent; Jonathan 16 percent; and Cortland, up 15 percent. Delicious apples registered a 4 percent decline while Gravensteins, Rome Beauties, Winesaps, and Yellow Newtowns reflected 1 to 2 percent reductions.

Red Delicious remained the Nation's leading variety, at 34 percent of the total U. S. Crop. Other leading varieties as a percent of total were: Golden Delicious, 18 percent; McIntosh, 10 percent; Rome Beauty, 7 percent; Jonathan, 5 percent; and York Imperial, 4 percent of total production.
