FOREWORD

This summary is a condensed report covering daily trading activities of growers and buyers at the Benton Harbor Cash Market during the 1973 marketing season.

Information contained in this summary include, total grower loads arriving at the market, package count, day buyer registration, prices paid to growers, also average prices for commodities with significant volume. Other important information include, total cash returns for the season, compared with other yearly averages. Narrative reviews of important commodities, with additional information influencing market price conditions.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Growers and Buyers who participated in the trading activities at the Benton Harbor Cash Market made this report possible.

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Total Michigan production of several major commodties declined considerably in 1973. Adverse weather conditions were sponsible for this abnormal season. Several factors, including unseasonably warm weather in March, followed by freezing temperatures in mid April and May caused heavy damage and production loss to most tree fruit. Commodities most affected were Apples, Red Tart and Sweet Cherries, also Peaches, Pears and Plums. Hot and dry weather prevailed in early June, late August and early September, sharply reducing yields of other important fruits and vegetables.

The total dollar value of all commodities sold at the Benton Harbor Cash Market during the 1973 marketing season was \$5,320,827.48. This was an 11 percent decrease, compared to 1972's \$5,987,864.66 and 23 percent lower than the 10 year average total cash return of \$6,945,906.00.

Grower loads sold at the Benton Harbor Cash Market in 1973 totaled 26,563 or 15 percent less than 1972's 31,591 and 43 percent less than the 10 year average of 47,102 loads recorded. Movement in carlot equivalents during 1973 was 1,169 or 30 percent less than 1972's 1,694 and 57 percent less than the 10 year average of 2,771 carlots.

NARRATIVE REVIEWS:

APPLES: Michigan total apple utilization was estimated by the Crop Reporting Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture. Total apple production for 1973 was 9,565,217 bushel, compared to 15,869,565 bushel in 1972 and 15,217,391 bushel in 1971. Apple receipts recorded at the Benton Harbor Cash Market in 1973 totaled 85,946 bushel, compared to 219,017 bushel in 1972 and 279,200 bushel in 1971.

Total cash returns to the growers from the Benton Harbor Cash Market during 1973 were \$460,670.56, compared to \$556,303.18 in 1972. Average price per bushel increased sharply in 1973 as a result of lower yields. Average price per bushel in 1973 was \$5.36, compared to \$2.54 in 1972.

Primary container used during the 1973 marketing season was 1/2 bushel and bushel baskets unclassified. Some fruit packed in 3/4 bushel wirebound crates and bushel cartons graded US#1 generally sold at slightly higher prices.

Adverse weather conditions reduced yields of both summer and fall varieties. Harvest operations were completed by most growers in early October. Varieties which decreased in yield the most, were McIntosh, Jonathans and Cortlands.

prices paid by Michigan processors' during 1973 were reported record high and competition for supplies was keen.

PEACHES: The 1973 season yields were the second lowest on record, although up sharply compared to 1972. Total receipts recorded at the Benton Harbor Cash Market during the 1973 marketing season were 4,504 bushel baskets, 23,824 3/4 bushel crates and 134,833 1/2 bushel baskets. The total cash value in 1973 was \$621,307.38, compared to \$116,748.55 in 1972. Peaches, ranked third in volume and cash returns at the Benton Harbor Cash Market in 1973.

Tabulation of peach volume at the market for 1973 and the preceeding tenyear average are listed.

The carlot conversion factors were changed in 1960. The peach conversion factor from 1960 through 1965 was 550 bushel per carlot equivalent and from 1966 through 1969, 600 bushel and 900 3/4 bushel per carlot were used. The factor used from 1970 through 1973 was 675 bushel, 900 3/4 byshel and 1350 1/2 bushel per carlot equivalent.

Data in the following tabulation was compiled from daily receipt sheets tabulated at the Benton Harbor Cash Market.

Truck movement was recorded daily and reduced to bushel basket carlot equivalent.

PLUMS-PRUNES: Total 1973 volume of all varieties declined sharply and was lowest on record. Receipts at the Benton Harbor Cash Market of 1/2 bushel cartons during 1973 were 43,423, compared to 73,332 in 1972, a decrease of 40 percent.

The average price per 1/2 bushel carton increased 11 percent from \$3.54 in 1972, to \$4.01 in 1973. Cash returns to growers however, decreased 32 percent. Total dollar value in 1973 was \$174,126.23 compared to \$259,595.28 in 1972. The Stanley prune variety accounted for a large percentage of the supplies. The primary container used in 1973 was 1/2 bushel cartons and few baskets.

TOMATOES: This commodity ranked second in total volume and dollar value during 1973 at the Benton Harbor Cash Market. Total movement over the market was 193 carlot equivalents, 14 percent less than the 227 carlots recorded in 1972. The primary container used during the 1973 marketing season was the 8 quart carton. The 8 quart carton represented 97 carlot equivalents, or 68 percent of the total volume.

The total dollar value of tomatoes sold at the market in 1973 was \$987,936.22 compared to \$1,227,443.87 in 1972. The total dollar value decreased 19 percent

in 1973. Average prices declined also for all packs, except 8 quart flat (Plum Type) and 12 pint flat (Cherry Type) which increased slightly in price.

STRAWBERRIES: According to the Crop Reporting Board, Statistical Reporting Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, estimated Strawberry crop production for all Spring states was 445,898,000 pounds for 1973, compared to 1972's 438,984,000 pounds. Total strawberry supplies from all Spring states increased 1.5 percent, while Michigan's production decreased 29 percent.

The total strawberry volume received at the Benton Harbor Cash Market in 1973 was 169,304 16 quart crate equivalents, compared to 293,254 16 quart crate equivalents in 1972. According to Southwest Michigan growers, the decline in volume was attributed to decreased planted acreage and sharply reduced yields at harvest time. Total Michigan planted acreage in 1973 was 3,600 acres, compared to 4,200 in 1972. Yield per acre varied but was estimated at 4,400 pounds in 1973 and 5,300 pounds in 1972.

Strawberry cash returns to the grower at the Benton Harbor Cash Market for 1973 were \$1,352,738.96 compared to \$1,768,321.62 in 1972. The weighted average price at the Benton Harbor Cash Market per 16 quart crate equivalent in 1973 was \$7.99, up 24 percent compared to \$6.03 in 1972.

The Federal-State Market News reporter recorded strawberry receipts moving direct to market, excluding those tabulated at the Benton Harbor Cash Market. The receipts were reported by growers and shippers selling direct to Wholesale Terminal Markets and other fresh market outlets. Considerable care was taken with each individual grower and shipper to avoid duplication. This volume totaled 94,800 16 quart crate equivalents, compared to 150,000 16 quart crate equivalents recorded in 1972. Using

the 1973 Benton Harbor Cash Market weighted average price of \$7.99 per 16 quart crate equivalent, the dollar value of this volume was estimated at \$757,452.00.

Deliveries to Southwest Michigan processors for 1973 was 1,719,081 pounds. Prices paid to growers were mostly 28ϕ per pound for frozen stock and $18-20\phi$ mostly 19ϕ per pound for juice stock. Total value at the processed level for all strawberries used for freezing was \$481,342.68.


