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## P R E F A C E

Information pertinent to the marketing of the 1967 California apricot crop is summarized in this publication.

The statistical tables appearing in this summary are very similar to those appearing in the 1966 issue of this publication.

Several new features of this summary include:

- (1) The addition of California apricot truck shipments as reported from shipping point in 1967.
- (2) A summary of information sources for apricot rail, air, and truck movement figures.
- (3) California apricot harvest starting and ending dates by producing districts, 1967.
- (4) Apricot carlot conversion factors in effect during 1967.
- (5) Historical summary of apricot wholesale market prices at Los Angeles and San Francisco, 1966-67.

All auction price data in this summary were compiled and tabulated from daily reports received from Eastern auctions and appear in published form during the season in the "Deciduous Fruit Reports" issued Monday, Wednesday and Friday by the Sacramento office of the Federal-State Market News Service. This office is operated by the California Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Market News, in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Consumer and Marketing Service.

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## MARKETING CALIFORNIA APRICOTS

### Summary of 1967 Season

Highlights of marketing California apricots during 1967:

- (1) California apricot producers received more than 20.8 million dollars for their crop in 1967, \$98,000 below the value of a year ago.
- (2) California production totaled 143,000 tons, down 41,000 tons from a year ago.
- (3) U. S. apricot production in 1967 was 24% below a year ago.
- (4) Average return to California producers for all uses was equal to \$146.00 per ton, \$32.00 per ton above 1966, and the second highest average of record.
- (5) Fresh movement of California apricots totaled 412 cars and carlot equivalents in 1967, well below the volume reported in recent years.
- (6) Western U. S. unload distribution of California apricots in 1967 was 42% below a year ago.
- (7) Based on total fresh California apricot distribution, the percent of apricots sold through auction increased by 6% over a year ago.
- (8) Auction sales of California apricots sold in Brentwood lugs averaged the highest of record, \$5.38 per lug.
- (9) Marketings of tight-fill pack lugs reached significant auction volume in 1967.
- (10) Chicago recorded the highest seasonal auction average in 1967 for California apricots sold in Brentwood lugs, \$5.61.
- (11) California apricots marketed intrastate during 1967 averaged higher than a year ago.

### INTRODUCTION

In 1967 California growers of apricots produced 143,000 tons of fruit valued at more than 20.8 million dollars. Production was down nearly 41,000 tons and was the second lightest crop in 10 years. Total value, however, dropped only \$98,000 below the level of 1966.

Yield per acre was more than a ton an acre below the average of 5.17 tons reported in 1966 and was largely the result of excess rainfall, hail and frost damage, and uneven set during the early part of the growing season.

United states production of apricots during 1967 was estimated at 148,000 tons. This was 24% below the 1966 estimate and the 5 year 1961-65 average.

Average return to California producers for all uses including fresh market, canned, frozen, and dried was equal to \$146.00 per ton at first delivery point. This was \$32.00 per ton higher than in 1966 and the second highest average on record.

### MOVEMENT AND DISTRIBUTION

California fresh market movement of apricots in 1967 totaled 412 cars and carlot equivalents. This was 235 carlots below 1966 and the lightest movement in recent years.

Out-of-state distribution dropped well below a year ago but accounted for a larger percentage of the total movement than in 1966. Air shipments were lighter than a year ago, due mainly to the late start of the season and competition from other deciduous fruits. Air shipment destination cities included New York, Philadelphia and Pittsburgh.

Truck shipments totaled 290 carlot equivalents, 25% below 1966. Distribution was widespread with destinations mostly midwestern and western markets.

Unload distribution in 41 U. S. and 5 Canadian Cities amounted to 390 cars and carlot equivalents by rail, truck and air. This was 37% below the volume unloaded in 1966. The western U. S. area experienced the sharpest drop in volume, 42% below a year ago.

Combined total intrastate unloads at Los Angeles and San Francisco-Oakland dropped sharply to 212 carlots compared to more than 360 reported in 1966. Los Angeles unloads were nearly 42% below 1966.

## MARKETING CALIFORNIA FRESH APRICOTS AT EASTERN AUCTIONS

## Summary of 1967 Season

Sales of California apricots at Eastern auctions totaled nearly 1,317 tons in 1967. This was more than 370 tons below a year ago and the lightest volume reported during the last ten years. However, based on total fresh marketings, the percent of apricots sold at auction increased by 6% over a year ago and continued as an important market outlet for California producers.

All varieties of California apricots auctioned in Brentwood lugs averaged \$5.38 during 1967, 47¢ above 1966 and the highest average on record.

Nearly 5000 tight-fill lugs, weighing approximately 26 pounds net, were marketed at auction. This was the first significant quantity of this container reported for sale. Although the all-auction average for this container was relatively low, some shipping sources expressed that quality of pack and fruit size markings on the container were the principal reasons for the limited trade acceptance, not container or type of pack.

Chicago recorded the highest seasonal auction average for offerings marketed in Brentwood lugs, \$5.61 per lug, 55¢ above the high reported a year ago at Philadelphia. New York led in total sales with more than 58,000 lugs.

In 1967, Royal apricots marketed in Brentwood lugs averaged \$5.41, 55¢ above 1966 and the highest average on record. Tiltions averaged slightly above a year ago at \$5.40, and Perfections were well above a year ago at \$5.17 per lug.

## PRODUCTION AND RETURNS

California apricot production in 1967, according to preliminary estimates of the California Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, totaled 143,000 tons, 22% below the revised estimate of 1966 and 24% below the 1961-65 average of 190,800 tons. Total United States production in 1967 was estimated at 148,000 tons, 24% below the 1966 estimate and the 1961-65 average.

As of November 1967, the Cannery League of California reported the 1967 season California pack of canned apricots was the equivalent of 4,212,785 cases of 24 No. 2½ size cans, 16% below 1966 and the smallest pack since 1963.
