P R E F A C E

Information pertinent to the marketing of the 1965 California crop of apricots are summarized in this publication. New features of this report include: (1) Presentation of fresh market California apricot movement and distribution expressed in %; (2) Unloads of apricots in 5 Canadian Cities, by month and year; (3) Wholesale market prices for California apricots at Los Angeles and San Francisco, showing weekly range and simple weekly average, 1965.

All auction price data in this summary are compiled and tabulated from daily reports received from Eastern auctions and appear in published form during the season in the "Daily Deciduous Fruit Reports" issued by the Sacramento office of the Federal-State Market News Service. This office is operated by the California Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Market News, in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Consumer and Marketing Service.

Summary of 1965 Season

Highlights of marketing California apricots during 1965:

- (1) Returns to California apricot growers for all uses averaged the lowest since 1949.
- (2) California apricot production was the largest in the last 5 years, estimated at 220,000 tons.
- (3) Fresh movement of California apricots was the heaviest in the last 10 years.
- (4) Fresh interstate movement was 30% above 1964.
- (5) Intrastate movement of fresh apricots dropped 8% below 1964.
- (6) Fresh interstate truck shipments in 1965 were heaviest on record.
- (7) Eastern auction sales of California apricots increased 16% above 1964.
- (8) Sales at Eastern auctions averaged \$4.06 over-all, \$1.24 below the record high of 1964.
- (9) Auction sales at New York accounted for 96% of the total metropolitan unloads at New York.
- (10) Pittsburgh recorded the highest auction average of the season, \$4.39 per lug.

INTRODUCTION

California growers of apricots in 1965 produced a commercial crop of 220,000 tons, 12,000 tons larger than in 1964, and the largest crop since 1960 when total production was estimated at 230,000 tons. It should be noted that from the total estimated 1965 production, 15,000 tons were classified as being "wasted" making utilized production actually 205,000 tons, or 3,000 tons below the utilization of 1964. Based on a 1965 bearing acreage of 37,800 acres, yield per acre averaged 5.82 tons, slightly above the yield of 5.55 tons set in 1964. Average grower return for all uses including fresh market, canned, frozen, and dried was equivalent to \$83.30 per ton at first delivery point, \$31.70 per ton below 1964, and the lowest average recorded since 1949. Growers' returns in that year were \$72.70 per ton based on a total production of 165,000 tons from 49,843 bearing acres.

MOVEMENT AND DISTRIBUTION

Fresh market movement of California apricots in 1965 was the heaviest in the last ten years. Total reported shipments by rail and truck amounted to 826 cars and carlot equivalents, 7% above 1964, and the heaviest movement recorded since 1955 when 1,042 carlots were reported. Interstate distribution totaled 464 carlots, 30% above 1964, and the largest quantity reported since 1955. Total intrastate unload distribution at Los Angeles and San Francisco-Oakland was below the high of 414 carlots set in 1964, but generally above the average unload volume recorded during the last ten years. Rail shipments accounted for 60% of the total interstate movement. Shipments of apricots by truck destined for out of state points totaled 185 carlot equivalents, one-third greater than in 1964, and the heaviest movement on record. Trucks destined for Canada and the states of Washington and Oregon showed sizeable increases over a year ago, reflecting the sharp drop in production due to winter freezes and spring frosts in these areas. The 1965 apricot crop in the State of Washington was cut to a mere 800 tons by freeze damage, whereas in 1964 production totaled 9,200 tons. Los Angeles continued to be the principal fresh market outlet for California apricots as unloads totaled 235 carlots in 1965, followed by San Francisco-Oakland and New York, respectively.

MARKETING OF CALIFORNIA FRESH APRICOTS AT EASTERN AUCTIONS

Summary of 1965 Season

Volume of apricots sold at Eastern Auctions increased by 16% above 1964, reflecting the larger California crop of 1965. Sales expressed in tonnage totaled 2,471.9 tons, 344.4 tons above 1964, or an increase in volume of 25 carlots. Volume of auction trading, when compared to total 1965 interstate movement, was less significant than in 1964 when lack of competition from Southeastern peaches provided strong Eastern and Midwest demand for apricots. Despite the fact that volume traded at auction increased by 16% over 1964, total metropolitan unloads of apricots at the six auction cities declined slightly from 207 to 205 carlots. In 1965 Boston reported auction sales for the first time in the last two years. New York again ranked first in total auction sales with 107 carlot equivalents, followed by Philadelphia with 31, and Chicago with 27.

Prices received at all auctions were well below the record high of 1964 and averaged \$4.06 for all varieties and containers, or \$1.24 below the 1964 average. Season average sales were the lowest since 1961 when the all variety and package average was \$3.68. Seasonal average prices received at auction were the highest at Pittsburgh, \$4.39 per Brentwood lug, followed by New York with a season average of \$4.33.

Royal apricots sold in Brentwood lugs averaged \$4.49 in 1965, 50¢ below 1964, but 42¢ per lug above 1963. Sales volume totaled 96,167 lugs, slightly above 1964 when 89,117 lugs were sold. Tiltons averaged \$2.70 per Brentwood lug in 1965, the lowest average recorded in the last 10 years. Auction trading in this variety totaled 65,380 lugs, more than 10,000 lugs greater than in 1964, and the heaviest volume sold since 1960. Prices received in 1965 for the Perfection variety averaged \$5.20 per Brentwood lug, 69¢ below 1964, but generally above the season averages for the last 7 years.

PRODUCTION AND RETURNS

According to preliminary estimates of the California Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, California apricot production for 1965 totaled approximately 220,000 tons, 5% above the revised estimate of 1964 and 12% above the 1959-63 average of 192,800 tons. Total United States production in 1965 was estimated at 220,910 tons, 1½% below the revised estimate of 1964, and 7% above the 1958-62 average.
