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MARKETING CALIFORNIA GRAPES FOR FRESH USE

NARRATIVE REVIEW OF THE 1971 SEASON

GENERAL HIGHLIGHTS:

Harvest of 1971 crop grapes began in Coachella Valley on Perlettes May 19, 1971, three days earlier than in 1970. Thompson Seedless harvest got under way June 15, also three days earlier. However, because of a late, cool spring, the initial harvest of table grapes in the southern San Joaquin Valley was on July 12, about two weeks later than in 1970. Thompson Seedless harvest did not start until July 23.

First f.o.b. trading was reported in the Coachella Valley on May 24 with Perlettes at \$12.00-12.50 per 22 pound lug. This was \$2.00-2.50 above the first f.o.b. report for the 1970 season. The first Thompson Seedless sales were at \$7.00-8.00, up \$.50-1.00 from 1970.

In the early Kern County district, first f.o.b. trading was reported July 29, 1971 with Thompson Seedless at \$7.50-8.00 per 25 pound lug. This compared with opening prices of \$6.50 per lug in 1970. Cardinals were \$6.50-7.00, up \$1.50 from the previous season. Ribiers opened at \$8.00-8.50, up \$2.00 from 1970. First Emperors were offered in mid-September at \$4.50, the same as the previous year.

Central San Joaquin Valley district active trading started August 10, a week later than in 1970. Initial f.o.b. sales on Thompson Seedless were \$5.00, \$1.00 below 1970. Cardinals opened at \$5.00, 50¢ above the previous year. First Ribiers were at \$6.00-7.00, about 50¢ above 1970. Emperors opened near mid-September at \$4.00-4.50, the same as the previous season.

Lodi district Tokay harvest began September 2. The start was delayed to achieve the high color required by the Marketing Agreement. Less than 10% of the Tokay crop moved to fresh market, with most of the tonnage going to wineries.

Fresh market grape prices for the entire season, all varieties and all areas, averaged \$166.00 per ton, down 6% from

1970 according to California Crop and Livestock Reporting Service estimates.

The 1971 fresh market table grape crop was light, but somewhat similar in size to the previous year. Rail and truck movement to market totaled 17,660 carlots or approximately 276,000 tons.

Unloads of table grapes in 41 U.S. cities totaled 11,092 cars, nearly the same as the previous season. Unloads in 5 Canadian cities were 1,508 cars, down about 7% from 1970.

Cold storage holdings of grapes at the peak level totaled 5,200,480 packages on October 31, 1971. This was the smallest peak holdings since 1967 when peak holdings were 4,057,400 packages on November 15.

Juice grape f.o.b. trading was extremely active, and prices were again the highest of record. Juice grape shipments to domestic and Canadian markets totaled nearly 10% above the previous season. Shipments of black, white, and mixed juice grapes totaled 4,644 cars compared with 4,258 cars the previous season or a little over 75,000 tons.

COACHELLA VALLEY:

Returns to growers during the 1971 season were very good, although growing and harvesting costs continued to increase. Shipping point prices were the highest on record. Most offerings met an excellent demand throughout the season. Shipments increased a little over 11% from last year.

Light harvest of Perlettes began on May 19, three days earlier than last year. Volume increased gradually until the peak was reached on June 8. A total of 91,511 lugs of Perlettes were shipped on this date. The period of heaviest Perlette shipments was from about June 2 through June 18. Daily shipments during this period ranged from around 45,000 to 91,511 lugs. Total shipments of Perlettes amounted to 1,300,240 lugs, compared with 1,286,751 lugs last year. The first report of f.o.b. prices was issued on May 24 with 22 pound lugs of Perlettes \$12.00-12.50. The trading level declined

gradually as shipments increased. Prices during the period of heaviest shipments ranged \$6.50-7.00. The simple average price for Perlettes, determined by using the mid-point of the quoted range or the "mostly" price, whichever is lower, was \$7.79.

Thompson Seedless harvest began on June 15, three days earlier than last year. Volume was light for a few days but a moderate level was reached by June 21. The individual high day for Thompson Seedless shipments was July 2 when 89,862 lugs were shipped. Daily shipments during the three week period from June 22 through July 11 generally ranged from 39,000 to 89,862 lugs. Total shipments of Thompson Seedless amounted to 1,483,107 lugs, compared with 1,116,803 lugs last year. F.o.b. prices ranged \$7.00-8.00 with most at \$7.50 throughout the season. Second labels were generally discounted \$1.00-2.00 depending upon appearance.

Shipments of Cardinals amounted to 270,050 lugs, compared with 243,681 lugs last year. Shipping point prices for 22 pound lugs generally ranged \$5.50-6.00 from June 14 through June 25. Prices advanced slightly on June 28, influenced by an active demand coupled with lighter supplies. Quotations from June 28 through July 2 ranged \$6.00-6.50 and from July 6 through July 9 were mostly \$7.00.

Other varieties harvested and shipped included Beauty Seedless, 48,020 lugs; Berenda Reds, 234 lugs; Thornburg Robins, 31,839 lugs; Superior Seedless, 246 lugs; Delights, 2,768 lugs; Richards Blacks, 290 lugs; Exotics, 30,947 lugs; and Ribiers, 893 lugs.

Total shipments of all varieties amounted to 3,168,634 lugs, compared with 2,756,063 lugs last year.

Acreage, according the County Agricultural Commissioner, totaled 8,485 acres, including 4,121 acres of Thompson Seedless and 3,295 acres of Perlettes. There were 354 acres of new plantings now bearing. Abandoned acreage during the past season was estimated at 588 acres.

The Coachella Valley was governed by a marketing order and operated under the guidance of the Desert Grape Advisory Board

SOUTHERN SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY:

Initial harvest of table grapes for fresh market was on July 12, about two weeks later than in 1970. Shipments for the first two weeks of the season were mainly of the Perlette and Cardinal varieties. Harvest of the important Thompson Seedless variety did not get under way until July 23. As volume increased, the first shipping point price report of the season was issued on July 29. Prices reported throughout the season were on the Thompson Seedless, Ribier, Cardinal, Exotic, Red Malaga, Emperor, Calmeria, and Almeria varieties.

First quoted prices of Thompson Seedless from the Arvin-Edison area were \$7.50-8.00 per 25 pound lug. Prices slowly declined as volume increased and as harvest progressed to the Delano area. Lowest prices of the season were reported in mid-September at mostly \$4.00-4.50 per lug. Bulk of the Thompson Seedless from the southern San Joaquin Valley district moved during the period when prices ranged \$4.50-5.00.

Ribier prices generally followed the same patterns of the 1970 season. There were relatively short periods of extremely high and low price ranges. Bulk of the Ribier movement came when prices were reported in the range of \$4.50-5.00 per lug. Trade sources indicated the quality of Ribiers as above average.

Emperor prices were first reported on September 17 at mostly \$4.50 per lug. With minor variations, this price level remained static until the latter part of October. On October 29, extreme cold weather plagued the area causing severe damage to the grapes remaining to be harvested. Most growers withdrew from the market pending full assessment of the damage. A few days later when trading resumed, price levels for Emperors increased to \$5.00-5.50 per lug. At this time, offerings of fresh picked fruit were for all practical purposes non-existent. On January 3, 1972, Emperor prices increased to \$5.50-6.00 per lug and maintained this level until the season ended in early March.

CENTRAL SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY:

F.o.b. trading in quotable volume was initiated August 10, seven days later than the 1970 season. Opening prices on 25

pound lugs of Thompson Seedless and Cardinals were \$5.00, down \$1.00 on Thompsons and 50¢ lower on Cardinals than in the preceding season. Ribiers opened with a range of \$6.00-7.00, mostly at \$6.50 compared with \$6.00 in 1970, and initial Emperor quotations at \$4.00-4.50 were identical with the previous season.

A simple arithmetic compilation of 1971 season f.o.b. prices indicates an average return of \$4.11 per lug of Thompson Seedless, 82¢ lower than the \$4.93 average in 1970; Ribiers \$4.71, 60¢ above the \$4.11 average in 1970; and Emperors down 9¢ at \$4.02 compared with \$4.11 the previous season.

Record breaking low temperatures in late October, dipping to a freezing 24 degrees in some sections of the six county central valley area, resulted in severe damage to many vineyards. The relatively warm reading of 29 degrees October 29 at the official weather station located on the Fresno Municipal Airport was the lowest October reading since record keeping was inaugurated in 1888.

Grape storage holdings were the lowest since the short crop of 1967. Peak holdings of Thompson Seedless amounting to 1,918,310 packages was reached on September 15. This total included 145,560 processors' lugs held for canners. Peak holdings of Emperor and Ribier grapes occurred October 31 with 3,245,340 and 585,110 packages respectively. Peak holdings of all grape varieties amounting to 5,200,480 packages was reached October 31, 1971, the fourth lowest storage holdings during the five year period 1967-71.

Trading was fairly active during the harvest season with daily offerings generally clearing and thereby diverting the usual heavy August-September flow to storage holdings. As in the previous seasons, practically all shipments moved on sales f.o.b. shipping point, with a minimal volume moving on consignment to auction or private sale markets. F.o.b. prices ranged from a low of \$3.50 on Thompson Seedless to a high of \$8.50 on Ribiers and Exotics with the bulk of trading on all varieties around \$4.50-5.50.

Cardinal and Red Malaga grapes, first of the early grapes, opened and held firmly throughout their trading period at \$5.00-5.50 per 25 pound lug, 50¢ to \$1.00 above the 1970 range.

Italias followed a declining market trend, opening at \$4.50-5.00 in late August, dropping to \$3.00-3.50 in mid-September, and closing the season at \$3.50.

Ladyfinger types enjoyed fairly good demand, opening the season at \$4.50-5.00 per lug for the first week, declining as supplies increased after Labor Day to range \$4.00-4.50 until September 24 when the price dropped to \$4.00 and held thereafter to close the season October 18.

Calmeria and Almeria grapes again enjoyed good distribution and favorable f.o.b. prices. Calmerias opened at \$4.50-5.00, adjusting downward to range \$3.50-4.50 into late October, then strengthening to \$4.00-4.50 through November. Almerias likewise reflected strength throughout the season, opening at \$3.50-4.50 and holding \$3.50-4.00 through October, then advancing to \$4.00-4.50 which held for the balance of the season ending December 3.

Ribier grape prices ranged from a low of \$3.75 in late October to the high opening price of \$7.00 per 25 pound lug in mid-August. September ranged \$4.00-5.50, mostly around \$4.00-4.50, October \$4.00, November \$4.00-4.50, December \$4.50-5.50 per 25 pound plain pack lug, and January-February \$4.00-5.00 for the 22 pound wrapped pack lug. Prices in 1971 were generally 50¢ above the 1970 level.

Emperor prices in 1971 were consistently well above the levels of the 1970 season. Opening at \$4.50 per lug in mid-September, trading quickly adjusted to \$4.00 through October 8, ranging \$3.50-4.00 through October 29 when the severe frost struck the area and eliminated further fresh harvest. A strong \$4.50 market with some labels held at \$5.00 and some low as \$4.00 prevailed through November and December. January trading enjoyed further strength to range \$5.00-6.00, mostly \$5.50-6.00, with February and March closing the season at a strong \$6.00.

Thompson Seedless grapes ranged from an opening season price of \$5.00 August 10 to close at \$3.25 in early November. Through the September harvest period prices held firmly at \$4.00-4.50 per lug and \$4.00 through October to close the season \$3.25-3.75 on the last offerings from storage.

CALIFORNIA JUICE GRAPES:

California's juice grape growers and shippers again experienced a "fantastic marketing season" for the 1971 crop. F.o.b. prices received generally exceeded the previous season by \$20.00-25.00 on Muscat variety; \$50.00-75.00 on Alicantes, Carignanes, and Grenache; and \$20.00-50.00 for Zinfandels. F.o.b. trading was extremely active throughout the 25 day marketing period September 20-October 15, 1971.

Juice grape shipments in 1971 totaled 4,639 carlot equivalents of black, white, and mixed varieties. The Lodi district supplied 755 rail and truck carlot equivalents of black juice varieties; the southern California district 114 equivalents, and the central California area 1,431 equivalents. Total black juice shipments amounted to 1,944 rail cars and 356 equivalents by truck, or a combined total of 2,300 cars. White juice shipments originate only in central California districts, ranging between Kern County to the south and Stanislaus County to the north, accounted for 1,828 rail cars and 202 equivalents by truck, for a total of 2,030 cars. Mixed juice rail cars amounted to 309.

Muscat grapes opened the season at \$180.00-185.00, advancing to \$200.00-210.00 at mid-point, and closing \$180.00-200.00 per

ton, packed in 36 pound lidded lugs.

Alicantes ranged \$230.00-260.00 during the season. Prices opened at \$235.00 then quickly advanced to range \$240.00-250.00, leveled at \$250.00 through September 27-October 4, advanced to \$260.00 through the Columbus Day holiday, then weakened to clean up the final shipments at \$230.00-240.00. Prices in the Lodi district held consistently at \$250.00-260.00 per ton throughout the trading season after opening at \$240.00.

Carignanes and Grenache in the central San Joaquin Valley district opened the season at \$235.00 with some preseason commitments at \$225.00. Prices immediately advanced to \$240.00-250.00, then \$250.00-260.00 during the period October 4-12 and closed firm at \$250.00. The Lodi district opened at \$240.00, immediately advancing to \$250.00 which held for the balance of the season.

Zinfandels in both the central valley and Lodi districts ranged from a low of \$275.00 to a high of \$320.00 per ton, with most sales throughout the trading season consumated in the range of \$290.00-300.00.

A few Malvoise were traded in the range of \$235.00-250.00, some Missions at \$250.00-265.00 and some Thompson Seedless at \$150.00-175.00 per ton packed in 36 pound lidded lugs.
