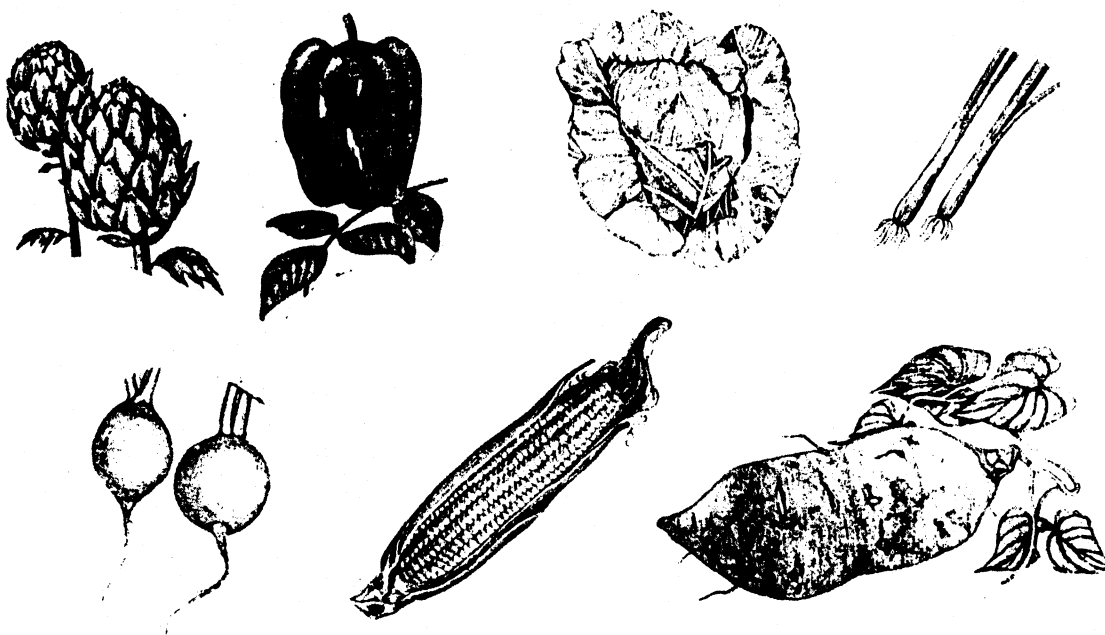

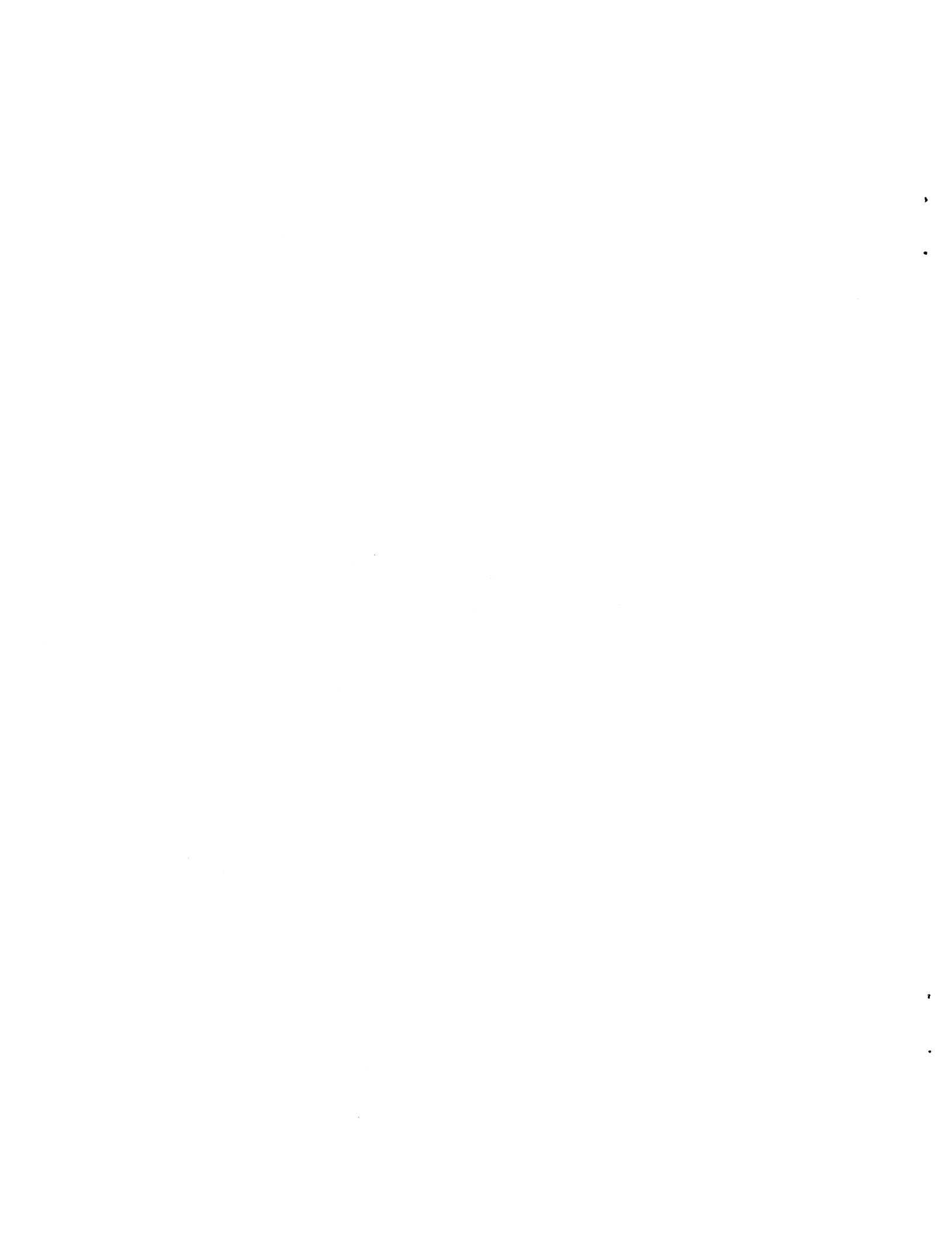

P R E F A C E

This publication summarizes available marketing data on selected California vegetable commodities which are not published in individual summaries. Data are included on shipments, shipping point prices, wholesale market prices, and arrival distribution. Commodities included are artichokes, bell peppers, cabbage, green onions, radishes, sweet corn, and sweet potatoes. These statistical records reflect the supply and demand factors that affected the marketing of these crops during the 1990 season.

Price, shipments and arrival data were collected by personnel of the Federal-State Market News Service. Printed reports issued at shipping point and wholesale market offices were used to complete the data assembled in these statistical tables. We wish to acknowledge and thank the employees of the Federal-State Market News Service for the data and information furnished by them. This report was prepared by David E. Vassar at Sacramento, and Melvin A. Ries and Ollie Shane at Stockton.

Price quotations shown in this summary reflect the shipping point and wholesale prices charged by primary shippers and receivers for the principal packs, varieties, grades and sizes. Prices are for stocks of generally good quality and condition. The price ranges shown are the general ranges of sales quoted in the official printed shipping point or wholesale market reports. Price quotations for small volume sales or sales shown as some, few or occasional in the printed reports were omitted from this summary to more clearly reflect general market trends.
