# **MARKETING GEORGIA AND SOUTH CAROLINA PEACHES**

**SUMMARY OF 1965 SEASON**

**MARKET NEWS SERVICE ON FRUITS AND VEGETABLES**

P R E F A C E

The Federal-State Market News Service began collecting shipping point information and issuing daily market reports for the 1965 peach season in Georgia on May 7, and South Carolina on June 15.

This publication represents a combined summary of Georgia and South Carolina Peach Production, shipments, F.O.B. Sales, and Distribution Records for the 1965 peach season, embracing the basic statistical records and supply and demand factors effecting the marketing of Georgia and South Carolina peaches.

The summary was prepared jointly by the Federal-State Market News Service offices located at Macon, Georgia and Spartanburg, South Carolina. Both offices are operated by the United States Department of Agriculture, Consumer and Marketing Service cooperating with the Georgia and South Carolina Departments of Agriculture.

Daily truck shipments for both areas were obtained through cooperation of the Federal-State Inspection Service. Variety names, types of containers and grade analysis of shipments were taken from official certificates issued by the service. The Georgia Peach Marketing Agreement and the South Carolina Extension Division of Markets compiled statistics relative to maturity, length of harvest season and total movement by varieties for which the local market reporters were most grateful. The cooperation of these agencies enabled the Market News Service to provide quick and accurate service for the benefit of the peach industry.

REVIEW OF THE 1965 GEORGIA PEACH SEASON

The Crop Reporting Board, U.S.D.A., estimated Georgia's 1965 peach crop at 4,800,000 bushels, considerably above the 1964 estimate of 1,800,000 bushels, and slightly below the 5-year (1959-63) average of 4,940,000 bushels. National production was placed at 74,096,000 bushels, slightly below the 1964 yield of 74,448,000 and the 5-year average of 75,320,000 bushels.

From the beginning there was a question whether Georgia orchards would accumulate the needed cold hours for dormancy. A late drop in temperatures brought this about. Trees started blooming in very late February and into early March. Bloom was an in and out thing. Some orchards had four distinct blooms lasting over a month period. Open winter weather and barely adequate dormancy was blamed for this unusual pattern. During bloom period rains fell almost every day and growers were unable to adequately apply dust and sprays for disease control. The resulting blossoms blight thinned orchards, but experts at the time held that first and second blossoms and possibly the third could develop and mature under very favorable conditions. As the season progressed it became evident the second and third bloom would not produce fruit. From mid March until June only light rains were recorded. They caused much concern about size especially early varieties. Most growers fertilized heavily to develop desirable size. Rains began about June 4 and continued daily until June 20 with some very heavy amounts recorded in that time. Early fruit mainly Maygolds, Redcaps, Cardinals, and Dixireds ran heavy to 2 inch sizes with many undersized. Some orchards were hard pressed to make the 1-7/8 inch size. Later varieties, Coronets, Keystones, Southlands, and Springs were excellent in size ranging mostly 2-1/4 to 2-1/2 inches.

Once harvest was under way quality was an almost continuous and uncontrollable problem. The rains prevented dust and spray application and many orchards became so badly infected with brown rot they were abandoned. The Statistical Reporting Service estimated that about 1,520,000 bushels were lost to abandonment. This includes 1,220,000 bushels not harvested. Many cars, which did pass inspection, arrived on terminals with decay as high as 60 percent. Color was also not up to standard although most shipments made U.S. Extra Color.

First inspection was reported May 9 with the first carlot shipment reported May 8. Volume did not develop until the first week in June. The next two weeks saw irregular volume because of rains. Peak day for the season was June 28 during the Coronet, Keystone, Southland harvest. 115 carlots moved that day. Shipments for the season were 1889 with 78 rail and 1811 truck carlot equivalents. This is far below the May 1 anticipation of 3000-3500 carlots.

Market wise the 1965 Georgia peach deal was a disaster, the worst in many years. Hardly anything went right from the very beginning. High prices for light early shipments declined rapidly when rains began taking heavy toll of quality. Many sheds closed because fruit failed to meet minimum grade requirements under Marketing Agreement regulations. Some orchards were abandoned. Packed fruit reached terminals in bad condition and was rejected. Buyer confidence was destroyed and, even through good fruit became available during Coronet and Keystone harvest, demand and buying was very limited. Prices held low on dull markets. The season just never got off the ground. Once momentum was lost it was never recovered.

Practically all fruit was wet brushed and hydrocooled. The wirebound crate, both half bushel and 3/4 bushel sizes continued to gain in popularity. Unofficial sources reported 75 percent of all fruit was packed in the crate type container. The tabulation in this summary prepared by the Industry Committee shows volume of crate packages as compared with basket type containers.

Processor usage was higher in 1965 because of greater available volume to processors. When fresh buyers did not take fruit, growers went to canners and wineries in an attempt to salvage some return from their crop. The tabulation prepared by the Industry Committee shows volume going to processors and winery outlets.

REVIEW OF THE 1965 SOUTH CAROLINA PEACH SEASON

Growing conditions varied from poor to good during the season. The trees continued to suffer from the extreme cold which hit the area during early 1964. Heavy rains covered practically all parts of the State during May and early June during 1965. Spray programs were hard to apply properly due to the continuing showers. The weather improved during the latter part of June. The hot days in early July brought about rapid maturity. Some varieties from the southern part of the State began to over-lap with those from the Piedmont Section further North. Rain began to hamper picking and growing conditions after mid-July. The cloudy skies and scattered showers caused some fruit not to "color-up" properly. The overall growing conditions were below normal. Many growers reported a very poor season.

The first commercial shipment of peaches this season was reported on May 12th, and was from the Branwell-Kline Area. The variety was Springtime. The first shipment of the Cardinal Variety was reported on May 28th from that same area. The Johnston Area began shipping Cardinals, Dixireds and Redcaps on June 6th. The volume continued light until about the middle of June. The Spartanburg Area reported their first Cardinals and Dixireds on June 14th. The State peaked in volume the week of July 5-11th. The estimated shipments that week were set at 38 rail cars, and 763 carlot equivalents by truck. The heaviest single day shipment came during that same week, on July 6th. That day, 155 carlot equivalents by truck and 6 rail cars moved to market. The volume began to taper off after the third week in July. The Johnston Area had finished the volume of their Redskins and Blakes by July 23rd. The volume of Elbertas was below normal previous years, therefore, the shipments tapered off early. The total movement from the State was set at 124 rail cars, and an estimated 4610 carlot equivalents by truck.

The quality was below normal this season. The heavy rains in June caused many peaches to deteriorate in transit. There was a constant "adjusting" of prices by the shipper due to the poor "carrying-quality." A few orchards escaped serious damage from the heavy rain. The yields were below normal for some varieties. This was especially true for Coronets, which were much below early expectations. Growers agreed that the orchards had not fully recuperated from the hard freeze the previous year. The quality was improved on the very late varieties.

Shipping point prices showed little fluctuation during the season. The market was considered high on the light volume of early shipments, but declined sharply around the middle of June. The price for three-fourths bushels of U. S. Number One Extra grade, 2 inch up in size, ranged from \$2.06-3.25 during July. The average price was around \$2.44-2.63. These prices do not reflect the true market returns, since many "adjustments" were made upon arrival, due to the poor carrying-quality. A more complete picture of the shipping point prices are covered elsewhere in this summary, and can be located by referring to the contents. It should be noted that these prices do not include any "adjustments" mentioned above.

There was a big change in the importance of varieties this season. Commercial shipments of Redskins topped the list for the first time. Southland was in second place, followed by Dixireds. The volume of Blake Variety increased sharply. This variety took fourth place volume-wise. The Elberta continued to decline in volume. This variety was located in tenth place from a volume standpoint. The volume of the late variety, Rio-Oso-Gem, increased. It was in fifth place.

The 3/4 bushel was the most popular container. It accounted for 94 percent of the overall volume shipped commercially. The 3/4 bushel crate continued to gain in popularity, and accounted for 66 percent of the total volume while 28 percent were put in 3/4 bushel baskets. The bushel basket declined in use.

The State of South Carolina had no marketing agreement this season, although practically all commercial shipments were inspected. Approximately 2 percent failed to grade U. S. Number One or better.

The Spartanburg office also reported the f.o.b. market on peaches produced in the Sandhill section of North Carolina during the period July 15 through August 2. The coverage was requested by the North Carolina Peach Industry. Reporting was made possible for the 1965 season through special agreements with the Federal Department and the South Carolina State Department. A tabulation of f.o.b. prices is shown on page 31.
