MARKETING LODI TOKAY GRAPES

Summary of the 1967 Season

The 1967 Tokay grape season was highlighted by one of the latest starts on record and extremely slow color development. As a result, shipments to fresh market were the lightest in over forty years. Quality of the fruit was considered good with berry and bunch size averaging about medium. Most growers experienced considerable difficulty in obtaining color as required under the Tokay Marketing Agreement, a federal marketing order.

Above normal temperatures in the month of August delayed color development and affected the sugar-acid ratio content of the grapes. Initial harvest began in a light way on September 4, three weeks later than last season. Rate of harvest progressed slowly until September 14 at which time shipments totaled slightly over 20,000 packages. During the month of September shipments totaled 801,783 packages, far below a normal season. Peak shipping day was reached on September 26 when 68,704 packages were shipped. On a peak day during a normal season shipments have exceeded 130,000. Shipments declined gradually until October 3 when rainfall totaling .18 of an inch brought a temporary halt to harvesting. Drying winds following the rain permitted many growers to resume harvest in a few days. However, many buyers were reluctant to purchase supplies except for shipment to nearby markets. Shipments continued to decline as many growers were having difficulty in securing experienced labor to harvest their grapes.

By the latter part of October shipments were running below 10,000 packages per day as most growers were diverting remaining supplies to processors. For all practicable purposes fresh market shipments were completed by the first week of November.

Due to the lack of confidence in the "carrying" quality of the fruit, holdings in cold storage were the lightest in many years. The volume of Tokays

in storage reached a peak of 8,350 packages on September 30 as reported by the Federal-State Market News Service at San Francisco.

The Tokay industry again operated under the provisions of the Tokay Marketing Agreement. The TMA, operating under Federal Law, is designed to create orderly marketing through control of quality and quantity of the supply marketed. Although there were no restrictions on quantity of supply marketed during the 1967 season, the industry voted to retain the grade regulations which were in effect the previous season. A regulation was also added to permit repacking lots of grapes that were initially rejected for grade defects.

The initial shipping point price report for the 1967 season was issued on September 13 at \$4.00 per 26 pound lug. As shipping volume increased, prices declined and the reported price on September 18 was \$3.00 per lug. This price level was maintained until October 4 when rain showers brought a halt to harvesting. On October 9 after trading had resumed the price level dipped to the season's low of \$2.50 per lug. At this point many growers were diverting to processors, enabling the diminishing fresh market supply to hold at this level for the remainder of the season. The last shipping point price report was issued on November 2, 1967.

Shipments to the six midwestern and eastern auctions reached new record lows during the 1967 season. A total of 5,271 packages of Tokays were sold at all auctions, continuing the downward trend of recent years. Sales at all auctions ranged \$0.97 to a high of \$4.15 for a weighted average price of \$2.97 per lug. Receipts at auctions were as follows: Chicago 820 packages; New York 3,130 packages; Philadelphia 1,321 packages; total 5,271 packages.
