S U M M A R Y
-----PRODUCTION

Maine's 1988 planted potato acreage of 81,000 was down from the 1987 total of 84,000 acres. The harvested acres of 80,000 was also down from 1987's 83,000 acres. Maine's production of 22,000,000 cwt was a decrease of 5 percent from last year's 23,240,000 cwt. The average yield of 275 cwt was 5 cwt lower than last year. The 1986 crop of 86,000 harvested acres had an average yield of 255 cwt giving a production total of 21,930,000 cwt. Shipments were below last year until mid-October, when they surpassed last years and remained so for the remainder of the season. Shipments through May 13th (in 500 cwt units) were truck 24,092 and rail 373 primarily used for processing for a total of 24,465. The comparable totals for last year through May 21st were 22,858 truck and 9 rail for a total of 22,867. The end of season total for 1987 crop was 24,904 truck and 69 rail. The end of season total for 1986 was 22,188 all by truck.

PLANTING

Planting started about normal with generally good weather. The 23rd of May found planting ahead of normal and completed by June 13th.

HARVEST

The Aroostook County harvest started slightly earlier than normal and progressed about normal. The harvest was nearly completed by the 17th of October. Wet rainy weather slowed harvest the early part of October and caused a little frost damage in Russets.

EXPORT

Export of Maine potatoes remained light for the season. Seed exports were Canada 114, Mexico 6, Thailand 5, and Venezuela 1. Table exports, mostly through New Jersey ports, were Puerto Rico 71 and West Germany 42.

PROCESSING

Maine processing totals were below last year until May 1st when they moved slightly ahead for the season. This season's May 1st processing total was 4,915,000 cwt. The end of season total for processing last year was 6,745,000 cwt.

S U M M A R Y

MARKETING

Lower production in the East and on Round Whites kept prices mostly firm for the entire season. This was the lowest production year in the East since regional records began in 1949. The FOB range for Maine Round Whites USone size A in 50 lb sacks was in the \$3.25-3.75 range until mid-November. The last week of November prices ranged from \$3.00-4.75 until January. January through mid-February prices ranged from \$3.75-4.25. The first of March prices were \$5.25-5.50 and steadily increased by May 12th to \$5.50-6.50. The price for baled 10 lb open window sacks were lowest September through late November when prices ranged from \$.90-.97. Late November into early December prices ranged \$.95-1.00. By mid-December prices fell back and ranged from \$.90-.97 until the first of March. From early March prices ranged from \$1.15-1.35 and increased to \$1.45-1.60 by the second week in May. Central Aroostook prices for Round Whites USone size A for 165 lb barrel were \$8.00 during September, \$8.00-10.00 during October. November through the first week of January prices ranged from \$10.00-11.00, the second week of January prices ranged from \$11.00 to a high of \$15.00 by early March. From early March prices ranged from \$15.00 to \$18.00 by May 12th. Southern Aroostook County prices in November were \$10.00-12.00. Mid-December to mid-February prices ranged \$11.00-13.00 and by mid March were in the \$16.00-17.00 range. The second of May prices ranged \$19.00-20.00. Major varieties planted were: Superior, Shepody, Russet Burbank and Ontario. Percentages planted were 20.2%, 16.9%, 14.9% and 13.0% respectively.

PACKAGING

Packaging remained fairly stable with most table shipments in 50 lb. and 10 lb. sacks with a good volume moving in 5 lb. sacks. The volume of 20 lb. sacks still remained fairly light.

TRANSPORTATION

(500 cwt. units)

Early shipments were lower than last year, but generally caught up and surpassed last years in October and remained ahead for the remainder of the season. Shipments totaled 24,092 truck shipments through May 13th. Last year's May 21st totals were 23,306. Last year's end of season total was 24,904. This year's highest shipment months were April 3,750, March 3,565, February 3,273. Last year's three highest months were: April 4,146, March 3,663 and January 3,009. Seed movement this year was above last year, while table was below last year. Chip stock was much above last year. May 13th totals this year were table 16,814, chippers 3,298 and seed 3,980. May 13th totals last year were table 17,406, chippers 2,285 and seed 3,106. Last year mid-of-season totals were table 24,904, chipper 2,285 and seed 3,760.
