GENERAL COMMENTS

Michigan peach producers had varied results in marketing their 1954 harvest, mostly fair, on the volume varieties. In general, Red Havens brought excellent returns. Size was large, benefiting yields, and the condition was good. However, this variety constituted only 6% of the crop. The few Golden Jubilees produced met very light demand at low prices. Halehavens & Elbertas which accounted for 79% of the State's production had an only ordinary to fair marketing season. Frequent heavy rains in mid and late August and early September in the principal peach producing areas in the Southwestern Michigan area impaired condition of both Halehavens & Elbertas, and made brown rot control difficult. Proper distribution was impaired due to varied condition of offerings. Also, the Halehavens peaked with the Centralia, Illinois area Elbertas and the Elbertas overlapped with the Colorado Elberta movement. Usually Michigan Elbertas get to market before the peak of the Colorado movement hits the market. An indication of the overlapping with Colorado this season is shown by Colorado rail shipments, which were 840 cars the week of August 14-21 and the peak of 1219 cars the week of August 21-28. The heavy Colorado truck movement was similar to rail shipments. Colorado Elbertas were in the markets in distribution on channels when Michigan Elbertas started moving actively the last week in August.

One saving factor putting a floor under Halehaven and Elberta prices was processor utilization. Data compiled by the Michigan Cooperative Crop Reporting Service from processors shows utilization of 550,000 bushels, 25% above 1953 handling of 439,000 bushels. The average price paid growers bulk per bushel was \$1.33, above 1953 when the average was \$1.29 per bushel.

Rio Oso Gem, and J. H. Hales f.o.b. sales were excellent on good quality fruit. Michigan production was estimated by the Crop Reporting Board (final, Dec. 1) at 2,410,000 bushels, 16% less than the 1953 crop of 2,870,000 bushels, and 33% below the 10-year (1943-52) average of 3,622,000 bushels. Heavier declines were noted in the Benton Harbor Cash Market movement. The 1954 peach movement over the Market amounted to 1,224 carlot equivalents and was 21% less than the 1953 movement of 1,533 cars, and 51% less than the 10-year average of 2,514 cars. The Michigan Cooperative Crop Reporting Service reports that 1954 is the fourth consecutive year in decline in bearing peach tree numbers, due principally to tree damage by the freeze in 1950. This decline is expected to be halted by 1955 or 1956 as new plantings come into bearing.

The movement of Michigan peaches, for which data is available, for 1954 is rail 56 cars. Benton Harbor Cash Market movement of 1,224 cars and sales to Michigan processors 1,375 cars. Data on truck movement from farms and packing houses direct to market is unavailable.

An increasing in marketing of tree run fruit in open bushel baskets and field crates was noted this season. Some growers and shippers moved the bulk of their crop in this manner. This was especially true of some Fruit Exchanges.

Bushel baskets continued to be the principal peach shipping container. Very limited packs of wooden boxes, bushel cardboard cartons and half bushel cardboard cartons were noted and about the same as usual. A few growers packed three-quarter bushel baskets in a limited way this season, which was an innovation in Michigan.

CHANGES IN MICHIGAN PEACH TREE NUMBERS

Released on September 30, 1954 by the Michigan Co-operative Crop Reporting Service.

For the fourth consecutive year there has been a sharp decline in bearing peach tree numbers. The primary cause for this decline was the severe untimely freeze of November 25, 1950. The State's estimated number of bearing peach trees has dropped from 2,000,000 to 1,800,000 and the acreage from 23,000 acres to 20,7000 acres. There are many young plantings of peaches approaching bearing age so that the downward trend will probably be halted by 1955 or 1956.
