

MARKETING THE MICHIGAN POTATO CROP  
A brief Review of the 1944-45 Season

Market reports on potatoes were issued from the Benton Harbor, Michigan office from October 10 to October 28, 1944 and from the Grand Rapids, Michigan office from November 1, 1944 to April 9, 1945.

National Situation

The national 1944 potato crop was estimated by the Crop Reporting Board December 18, 1944 at 379,436,000 bushels, which is 18% smaller than the 1943 crop of 464,999,000 bushels, and 4% above the 10-year (1933-42) average of 362,912,000 bushels. In the 18 Surplus States, production was estimated at 271,479,000 bushels compared to 328,581,000 bushels for 1943, which is 17% less than the 1943 crop, and 8% above the 10-year average of 249,821,000 bushels. Production in the 30 Late States was placed at 298,964,000 bushels compared to 364,011,000 bushels in 1943, and to the 10-year average of 288,276,000 bushels.

Rail shipments for the 1944-45 crop through April 7 totaled 240,730 cars compared to 264,065 cars a year ago to date and final 1943-44 shipments of 286,719 cars.

Michigan Situation

Michigan's 1944 potato crop was estimated December 18, 1944 by the Crop Reporting Board at 18,360,000 bushels, which is 18% less than the 1943 crop of 22,365,000 bushels and 23% less than the 10-year (1933-42) average. A decrease in acreage occurred with 1944 plantings placed at 170,000 acres compared to 213,000 acres in 1943 and the 10-year average of 248,000 acres. Average yields per acre were placed at 108 bushels compared to 105 bushels per acre in 1943 and 96 bushels per acre for the 10-year average.

Quality, Condition and Size

Average quality was shown in the 1944 potato crop with scab being the prevailing defect. Size was exceptionally good with approximately 90% of graded stock meeting Size A specifications. Very little damage was reported by hollow heart.

F.o.b. Situation

The f.o.b. situation followed in the style of other years during the late fall months with Russet Rurals ranging from \$2.10-2.25 and Chippewas ranging from \$2.20-2.40 f.o.b. country shipping points until the first part of December. During December prices increased steadily, and by the first week of January, practically all sales were made at ceiling with exceptionally good demand. Ceiling prices continued throughout the remainder of the season, although about April 1 demand decreased considerably. The good demand and ceiling prices, which were maintained during the winter months, were caused by several factors: first, the 1944 crop was considerably less than 1943; second, the Government permit system set up in the principal potato sections, such as, Maine, Idaho, Red River Valley Section, California, and Michigan, to insure adequate supply of potatoes for the armed forces; third, a shortage of refrigerator cars, which was rather serious at times, and rail facilities overburdened causing delays in transit. Prior to the start of the Government permit system in the State of Michigan, with all carlot sales being made at delivered ceiling, it was almost impossible for the old line distributors to buy from the growers at a price they could pay and stay within the delivered ceiling. This condition was caused by truckers, terminal buyers, and peddlers buying direct from the grower at higher prices. This condition was relieved considerably after the permit system was set up and carlot shipments increased and truck shipments decreased. Compulsory Federal-State inspection was in effect this season.

Rail Shipments

Rail shipments through April 7 amounted to 4,550 cars as compared to 3,493 cars a year ago to date, and final shipments for 1943 of 5,241 cars. Truck shipments through April 9, Federal-State inspected, totaled 3,296 carlot equivalents compared to 3,076 carlot equivalents for the 1943 season.

Distribution

Rail destinations were not carried in our daily reports this season. Truck destinations were reported by Federal-State inspection and indicate most movement was to nearby markets. Michigan received the largest amount, with Indiana second, Illinois third, and Ohio fourth, with a total of 11 states receiving Michigan tubers by truck.
