

REVIEW
MARKETING WESTERN NEW YORK CABBAGE
SEASON 1933-34.

Daily market reports on cabbage were issued from the Rochester Office from September 1, 1933 to February 27, 1934. This review carries destinations of carlot shipments through March 14, 1934.

From a standpoint of production, the 1933 cabbage crop was a distinct disappointment. However, the prices received for the curtailed crop were high enough to compensate in a large measure for the reduced tonnage. During the early part of September most of the growers' offerings were being taken by the kraut factories. Carlot shipments for market were restricted in that kraut plants were offering as much money to growers early in the season as dealers could obtain from the wholesale trade. The shortage of the crop of Domestic type cabbage caused keen competition between the shippers of market stock and kraut manufacturers. An unusual departure was made in that many carloads of Danish cabbage were used for kraut purposes. Cash prices to growers this season ranged \$12 to \$45 per ton, mostly \$18 to \$30, whereas the very unfavorable comparison existed during the 1932-33 season of \$2 to \$8, mostly \$3 to \$5 per ton. Shippers sold carlots of Domestic f.o.b. shipping points this season at \$14 to \$21 for bulk stock and \$18 to \$25 per ton in sacks. Danish cabbage prices opened in September at mostly \$20 to \$23 for bulk and \$22 to \$27 sacked per ton. During early October the carlot market weakened to the lowest point of the season, \$18 to \$22 per ton for bulk Danish. Prices held at low levels during the balance of that month, showed a stronger tendency in November, and by December sales of bulk shipments at \$40 to \$45 were not uncommon. For any good stock high prices were received thereafter. See Page 4 for complete data on weekly range of f.o.b. prices.

The destinations of daily shipments as carried on the market reports, and as tabulated on Page 4, show 5503 cars shipped between August 31, 1933, and March 14, 1934. For the entire season to date there have moved by rail 5586 cars, or about 4200 less than the outturn of the 1932-33 season. Movement by auto-truck was very active again this season especially to the kraut plants.

The acreage of Domestic cabbage in New York was estimated at 8000 acres, supplying an average yield of 6.5 tons per acre and a production of 52,000 tons. The Danish crop was placed at 24,800 acres, with a state yield of 7.0 tons per acre. The production of this type of storage cabbage equalled a gross of 122,600 tons, or more than 65,000 tons under the 1932 crop. The production of all late cabbage in New York this season represented 174,600 tons, or better than 100,000 tons less than the 1932 crops. The production of all late cabbage in the country was 380,400 tons compared with 621,100 tons last season. (See Page 2 for detailed tabulations).
