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MARKETING WESTERN AND CENTRAL NEW YORK CABBAGE - 1957-58 SEASON

Daily Market Reports were issued on cabbage from the Rochester Office of the Federal-State Market News Service, Genesee Valley Regional Market Admn. Bldg., 900 Jefferson Rd., Rochester 23, N.Y. from August 23, 1957 through March 7, 1958. Information contained in this summary was obtained from these reports and from releases issued by the Crop Reporting Board, Agricultural Marketing Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture and by the Office of the Agricultural Statistician, Albany, New York.

UNITED STATES

The acreage, yield and production of cabbage this season was considerably lower than during the 1956 season as well as the 7-year (1949-55) average. This season the acreage planted to cabbage for fresh market was estimated at 112,790 acres as compared with 125,110 acres in 1956, while the 7-year average for the country was 137,330 acres. Yields this season were estimated at 169 cwt. as compared with 184 cwt. in 1956 and 162 cwt. for the 7-year average. Total production this season was estimated at 19,086,000 cwt. as compared with 22,980,000 cwt. in 1956, while the 7-year average was 22,280,000 cwt.

The acreage planted to cabbage for sauerkraut under contract this season was 11,610 acres as compared with 16,370 acres in 1956, while the 10-year average (1946-55) was 16,580 acres. Yields per acre were slightly lower than last year but considerably higher than the 10-year average. This season the average production per acre was estimated at 14.6 tons as compared with 15.8 in 1956, while the 10-year average was 11.4 tons. With a smaller acreage and lower yields per acre, this year's production was estimated at 169,500 tons as compared with 258,900 tons in 1956 and the 10-year average of 191,900 tons.

NEW YORK STATE

The acreage planted to Domestic cabbage in New York State this season was estimated the same as a year ago, 1700 acres as compared with 2,360 acres for the 7-year (1949-55) period. Yields were below last season but higher than average; 310 cwt. per acre as compared with 360 cwt. in 1956, while the 7-year average was 247 cwt. Total production of the Domestic type this season was estimated at 527,000 cwt. as compared with 612,000 cwt. in 1956 and the 7-year average of 590,000 cwt. Acreage planted to the Danish type this season was considerably lower than last year and the 7-year average; 7,600 acres this season as compared with 9,000 acres in 1956, while the 7-year average was 9,700 acres. Yields this season were considerably below last year but about the same as the 7-year average. Average yield per acre during 1957 was estimated at 230 cwt. as compared with 320 cwt. in 1956 and the 7-year average of 232 cwt. With less acreage and lower yields, total production of Danish this season was estimated at 1,748,000 cwt. as compared with 2,880,000 cwt. in 1956, while the 7-year (1949-55) average for the State was 2,257,000 cwt.

New York State continues to lead in cabbage planted for sauerkraut both in acreage and production. This season, 4,100 acres were planted for kraut under contract as compared with 5,500 acres in 1956, while the 10-year average for the State was 6,130 acres. Yields this season were estimated at 15.5 tons per acre as compared with 18.0 tons during 1956, while the 10-year average was 13.2 tons. Production during 1957 was estimated at 63,600 tons as compared with 99,000 tons in 1956, while the 10-year average for the State was 80,900 tons.

Unfavorable weather during early June delayed planting to some extent. Hot, dry weather during July and August delayed growth and rains coming in September, while improving the crop to some extent, caused considerable cracking of heads. Some damage was reported caused by aphids. Because of the late planting date in some sections, yields were considerably lower. Processors reported many cracked heads received from growers of the Domestic type. The movement into storage was later than usual, due to the fact that growers delayed harvesting as long as possible to gain size. Harvesting of the Domestic was about 86 percent completed by November 1 this season as compared with 70 percent a year ago, and the Danish crop was 60 percent completed as compared with 30 percent the previous year on the same date. Harvesting was completed by mid-November.

Stocks of Danish type cabbage on hand in producing areas of New York State on January 1 were estimated at 434,000 hundredweight. This year's January 1 stocks are less than half of the stocks a year earlier and 15 percent below average. The low level of this year's stocks is the result of the smallest crop in recent years and active movement. Stocks estimates include cabbage for both fresh market and kraut.

F.o.b. prices at western New York shipping points ranged much higher than a year ago. From the beginning of the season in mid-August until the end of December, prices on 50 lb. sacks of Danish ranged from \$.90-2.00 and then advanced sharply ranging from \$1.60-4.00 during January and February. The price range throughout last season was \$.55-1.90. Prices paid growers sacked per ton delivered this season ranged from \$20.00-60.00 per ton from mid-August through December and then advanced to a range of \$50.00-110.00 in late February. Last season the price ranged from \$10.00-50.00 per ton throughout the season. Prices paid growers for large Domestic and large Danish for kraut this season ranged from \$15.00-30.00 per ton as compared with \$6.00-12.00 per ton last season.

Practically the entire crop moved to market this season by truck as only 42 cars were reported moving by rail.

PROCESSING

The kraut manufacturers contracted this season mostly around \$12.00 per ton but many purchases were made on the open market from \$20.00-30.00. Because of the light production this season there was an active demand for large stock for kraut.

NEW YORK CABBAGE STOCKS

JANUARY 1, 1958

Stocks of Danish type cabbage on hand in producing areas of New York State on January 1 were estimated at 434,000 hundredweight. This year's January 1 stocks are less than half of the stocks a year earlier and 15 percent below average. The low level of this year's stocks is the result of the smallest crop in recent years and active movement. Movement of New York Danish cabbage to January 1 is running slightly ahead of last year when production was 45 percent larger than the small 1957 crop. With the major portion of the late fall crop from Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina marketed prior to January 1 and reduced prospects in Florida and Texas, where the bulk of the winter crop is grown, January 1 stocks should clean up readily. New York production and stocks estimates include cabbage for both fresh market and kraut.

NEW YORK DANISH CABBAGE: Production and stocks held on December 1 and January 1 in or near areas of production by growers and dealers, average 1946-55, 1956 and 1957 crops.
