CABBAGE SUMMARY 1964-65 SEASON

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MARKETING WESTERN AND CENTRAL NEW YORK CABBAGE - 1963-64 SEASON

Daily Market Reports on cabbage were issued from the Rochester office of the Federal-State Market News Service, 900 Jefferson Road, Rochester, New York from September 4, 1964 through March 26, 1965. The information contained in this summary was obtained from these reports and other releases by the Crop Reporting Board, U.S. Department of Agriculture and from the State Statistician in Albany, New York. At this time we wish to thank the growers, shippers, brokers, processors and others for their cooperation. Your comments are always welcome.

UNITED STATES

Production of cabbage for fresh market and processing during 1964 was slightly lower than either 1963 or the five year average. Production this year was 21,961 thousand hundredweight compared with 23,169 thousand hundredweight in 1963 while the five year 1958-62 average for the country was 23,228 thousand hundredweight. Yields per acre were slightly lower than last year but the same as the five year average. Harvested acreage during 1964 was 119,320 as compared with 119,955 during 1963 while the five year average for the country was 126,330 acres.

NEW YORK STATE

Weather conditions varied greatly during the summer. May was generally warm and moisture varied greatly in Western and Central New York. Some early cabbage was planted in late May but in general the crop was planted mostly in June. June was generally cool until the latter part and most of the State had below normal rainfall. In July, the rainfall was generally below normal, soil was critically dry in most sections. The crop developed slowly due to dry weather in most of August. In late August beneficial rains relieved the dry topsoil over much of the State. Because of the dry weather during the summer the crop was delayed, but in general harvesting started about the same time as usual. This extremely dry weather during the summer retarded head formation and sizes this season.

F.o.b. prices at western and central New York shipping points this season were considerably higher than last season. 50 lb sacks of small, medium, and large, ranged from \$1.10-3.25 as compared with .75-1.60 during the 1963-64 season. On another page in this summary will be found weekly price ranges for this season and for the 1963-64 season.

PROCESSING

Production of cabbage for sauerkraut in the State this season was considerably lighter than last year and the five year 1958-62 average. This season production was estimated at 52,700 tons as compared with 75,000 tons during 1963 while the five year average for the State was 73,440 tons. New York continues to be the leading State in cabbage for sauerkraut followed by Wisconsin and Ohio. The contract price this season was \$10.00-11.00 per ton. Purchases on the open market started about the first of October at prices ranging from \$12.00-18.00 per ton. Beginning in late October, processors advanced their prices for purchases on the open market to \$20.00-30.00 per ton through the remainder of the season.
