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MARKETING WESTERN AND CENTRAL NEW YORK CABBAGE - 1966-67 SEASON

Daily Market Reports on cabbage were issued from the Rochester office of the Federal-State Market News Service from September 12, 1966 through April 7, 1967. The information contained in this Summary was obtained from these reports and from releases issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the New York State Crop Reporting Service, Albany, New York. We would like to thank the growers, shippers, brokers, processors and others for their cooperation.

NEW YORK STATE

Temperatures averaged lower than normal for the entire month of May and all early planted fields made slow progress. June temperatures were about normal but a serious dry spell started late in the month.

In Western New York, dry and hot weather in early July delayed Fall crop cabbage setting and caused heavy loss to young plants. Rains and cooler temperatures in late July favored growth and development. At that date, the crop outlook was for lower yields than last year.

Fresh market cabbage harvest started early in August. Cutting of cabbage for fresh market and for kraut became active in all Upstate sections during the latter part of September and was in full swing by the first week of October. In the storage sections of Monroe and Orleans Counties, the late Danish crop harvest started in late October and continued active through November.

Western New York shipping point prices started the season sharply higher than last year. Prices for good condition lots continued a gradual advance until February and after which date, prices declined to somewhat lower levels. The one exception being cold storage cabbage which as expected, sold at premium highs starting in early February. In general, the price level easily doubled those prevailing last year. A full weekly breakdown of shipping point prices with comparisons are detailed on page 2.

Shippers price to growers reflected even stronger price advances from the start of the season. September prices to growers opened at mostly \$50.00 sacked per ton and climbed to \$60.00 and \$70.00 in November and reached a peak of \$90.00 during January. Starting in late October, shippers actively bought bulk cabbage for storage. Some shippers bought uncut acreage. A weekly seasonal price breakdown with comparisons is shown on page 3.

PROCESSING CABBAGE

Kraut plants found themselves in short supply all season and bought aggressively on the open market. Contract tonnage was available early in the season but fell far short of demand. Open market buying soon became the chief source of supply and prices were bid up sharply. Open bulk prices advanced in November and reached \$60.00 per ton with some sales reported in excess of that amount. A full price breakdown of kraut plant buying, with comparisons to last year, appears on page 3.

In review, this season was marked with lower than average acreage and yield. Prices were always sharply higher than last year. On the other side of the picture, substantial acreage in Orleans and Monroe Counties were hit by blackleg infestation which cut out many fields entirely and reduced quality and yield for many more. As was expected, Dutch imports became a factor later in the season but the size and delivery system of the imports surprised growers and shippers alike. On the whole, this was a very successful season for most of the trade.
