Market reports on carrots were issued from the Rochester office from September 1, 1933 until May 13, 1934.

New York State continues to lead all other states in the production of late carrots. This season the estimated acreage in this State was 1,650 as compared with 1,800 during 1932, and with 2,300 in 1931. Yield per acre for the State this season was slightly less than a year ago, but the same as in 1931. This season yield per acre was placed at 465 bushels in contrast with 515 bushels per acre in 1932. The total production for the State was estimated at 767,000 bushels, while in the 1932 season the production was placed at 927,000 bushels. For all the states producing late carrots the production in 1933 was 2,412,000 bushels in comparison with 3,001,000 bushels in 1932. For the entire United States the 1933 production was estimated to be 10,565,000 bushels as compared with 10,815,000 in 1932.

The carrot prices at western New York shipping points fluctuated very little from the beginning of the season, at which time the f.o.b. price on 100 lb. sacks was 85¢. The price dropped to 70¢ during the week ending November 4 and reached the peak of \$1.35 on March 3. As on some other commodities the f.o.b. price this season on carrots was just about twice that of a year ago. The quality of western New York carrots this season was generally satisfactory. The soup companies and canners are large users of carrots from this State.

The movement by rail as shown in the table below shows that New York State carrots were billed to 13 States and the District of Columbia this season, New York City, Camden, N. J., Baltimore, and Philadelphia taking nearly three-fourths of the rail movement.
