MARKETING WESTERN NEW YORK CELERY

SUMMARY OF 1936 SEASON

The acreage of late celery in western New York this season was estimated at 3,600 acres or a decrease of about 5 percent from the 3,800 acres planted in 1935. The Michigan acreage was also lighter and amounted to 3,600 acres or about 600 acres less than in 1935. Total acreage in the two groups of late states amounted to 12,410 acres in 1936 compared with 13,140 acres in 1935.

Because of the dry weather, conditions in August indicated a light crop of celery in western New York. Rains during September and October were very beneficial, and the crop overcame the ill effects of the dry summer, and early October conditions indicated a crop larger than the 1935 production despite the lighter acreage. However, frosts late in October seriously damaged the crop still in the fields, and much of the celery remaining in the fields at the time of the freeze was not harvested. Final estimates showed a 1936 production of 954,000 crates of the 2/3 size compared with the production of 1,140,000 crates in 1935. However, production in several competing sections was heavier than in 1935, and the total crop in the two groups of late states was slightly larger than in 1935.

New York celery started into storage earlier than usual. On October 2, total holdings in 24 storages amounted to 191,657 crates. Holdings of 369,383 crates on October 23 were the heaviest for any date since the 1932-33 season. Because of the severe freeze on October 26 and 27 which seriously damaged most of the celery remaining in the fields, shipments after those dates came mostly from cold storage. Movement from storage during November was very heavy, and in the week preceding the Thanksgiving holiday, nearly 100,000 crates were taken out of storage. Most celery was moved from storage before the end of December.

The fall crop in California amounted to 11,500 acres or an increase of more than one-fourth over the acreage in the fall and winter of 1935-36. Although much of the fall and winter crop in California was severely damaged by cold weather, this damage occurred late in the season after most New York stock had been shipped and had little effect upon the market for New York celery.

Shipments from California started to move late in October, and the movement during November and December was quite heavy. October shipments amounted to 101 cars, November shipments totalled 1793 cars, and December shipments amounted to 1997 cars. Late in December the Florida crop started to move in a light volume.

Prices were considerably lower than during the 1935 season. On September 5, 2/3 crates of crate-washed stock sold \$1.30-1.35 for the 3 to 6 dozen size. Prices declined rapidly to around \$1.00 per crate and held mostly in a range of 90¢-\$1.00 until after the late October freeze. After the last week in October, prices rose gradually to a peak of \$1.50-1.75 about the middle of November. Celery shipped after November moved mostly on a consignment basis.
