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MARKETING WESTERN AND CENTRAL NEW YORK

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SEASON 1936-1937

Daily market reports on onions were issued from the Rochester office from September 1, 1936 to April 24, 1937.

The information contained in this review consists principally of material published in the daily reports at Rochester, statistics released from Washington, and data from the Agricultural Statistician at Albany. It is hoped that the records as presented on the pages that follow will prove to be informative and of assistance in formulating plans for other seasons.

The acreage of late onions in the United States was somewhat smaller than last season. According to the final estimates, there were 54,110 acres planted this season in comparison with 57,480 last season, and with 47,280 during the 1934-35 season. The production in the Late group of States was equivalent to 11,811,000 (100-lb.) sacks as compared with 10,172,000 (100-lb.) sacks last season. The average yield in the Late group of States was 218 sacks per acre this season compared with 177 sacks in 1935 and the 10-year (1923-32) average of 185 sacks.

NEW YORK STATE

The acreage in the State was increased from 10,700 acres in 1935 to 11,600 in 1936. The yield per acre this season was much higher despite the dry weather and was estimated to be 280 sacks per acre as compared with 215 sacks in 1935 and 275 in 1934. This season's yield was the highest for the past five seasons. The final estimates show the State produced a crop of 3,248,000 (100-lb.) sacks this season as compared with 2,300,000 sacks in 1935, 2,475,000 sacks in 1934, 2,021,000 sacks in 1933, and 2,105,000 sacks in 1932.

For the State as a whole, this year's crop was one of the best on record. In general, the sizes were large and of good quality with very little damage from maggots, blight, and thrip. In Genesee

and Orleans counties, known as the Elba section of the State, conditions were not as good as in other sections. Late frosts and high winds in that section injured many of the earlier plantings. The dry weather which damaged some of the other crops did little or no damage to the onion crop of the State, and most of the onions cured in good condition. Weather at harvest time was excellent and many of the onions were still too green to harvest the later part of September.

During most of the marketing season, the f.o.b. prices at western and central New York points ranged slightly lower than during the 1935-36 season. 50-lb. sacks of Yellows, U.S.No.1, 40 to 90 percent. 2 inches and larger, ranged from 40¢ to 60¢ from September 1st until the end of January. After that time, an advance was made and prices ranged from 48¢ to \$1.20, and the season closed around the later part of April at prices ranging from 80¢ to 95¢. A few sales were made after the market reports were discontinued as low as 70¢.

The movement by rail from the State this season to April 24th filled 4,424 cars as compared with 3,800 during the corresponding period last season. Keen competition from Michigan prevailed throughout the entire marketing season and that State moved 6,897 cars to April 24th as compared with 3,554 during the previous season to the same time.
