Daily market reports on onions were issued from the Rochester office from August 15, 1938, through April 21, 1939.

The late commercial onion crop in the United States for 1938 was estimated to be 11,132,000 sacks (100-lbs.) as compared with 10,433,000 sacks (100-lbs.) during 1937. The 10-year average (1927-36) was 9,911,000 sacks (100-lbs.). The production during 1938 was 6 percent above that of 1937 and 12 percent greater than the 10-year average (1927-36). The acreage in the Late States during 1938 was 54,430 acres in comparison with 52,240 in 1937, while the ten year average (1926-37) was 52,700 acres. The average yield per acre was estimated at 205 sacks (100-lbs.) this season as compared with 200 sacks in 1937. The average yield over the ten year period (1926-37) was placed at 188 sacks (100-lbs.). The increase during 1938 was caused both by increased acreage as well as production. The rail movement from the Late Group of States through April 29 was 19,634 cars as compared with 22,279 to the same time the previous year. Despite the fact that a much larger crop was grown during 1938 than in 1937 the rail movement showed a decline. This was caused partly by the increased movement via truck and shrinkage. On January 1st, stocks of late crop onions on hand totaled 3,359,000 sacks (100-lbs.) or about 8 percent more than a year earlier and 11 percent more than the 1929-37 average. As compared with a year earlier, stocks of onions were smaller in the 3 Eastern States, but larger in both the Central and Western groups of States. The January 1st holdings in the Western States were the largest of the 11 year period, largely because about 492,000 bags were left in the field unharvested in New York and Massachusetts last fall compared with only 64,000 bags in 1937, shrinkage and waste to January 1 was considerably larger than a year earlier. About 19 percent of the disappearance to January 1 was wasted, about 38 percent was moved to market by motor truck and 43 percent by rail or boat.

New York State continues to rank first in the Late Group of States in the production of onions, and is second in national production, exceeded only by Texas. During 1938, New York State produced a crop estimated to be 2,961,000 sacks (100-lbs.) as compared with 2,572,000 sacks (100-lbs.) during 1937. The ten year average (1927-36) was 2,038,000 sacks (100-lbs.). The acreage planted in the State this season was increased slightly, 14,100 acres in comparison with 13,680 in 1937, while the ten year average (1926-37) for the State was 8,750. The yield per acre was above that of last year but below the 10 year average. Yield during 1938 was estimated to be 210 sacks (100-lbs.) as compared with 188 sacks (100-lbs.) in 1937. The 10-year average (1927-36) was 228 sacks (100-lbs.).

In practically all areas of the State the onion crop was looking fine on July 1, but late in that month high temperatures accompanied by high humidity aided the mildew in getting a start. Then late in July the heavy rains brought on floods in Orange and parts of Wayne and Cayuga Counties. These ruined outright some of the onions and stopped growth on many others. From that time on, the onions in these flooded areas continued to decline on account of the large amount of decay, sprouted onions, etc., brought on by the hot, moist weather. A still further loss was occasioned by the hard storms of late September. From some fields no onions were harvested and from others probably not over 50 percent was salvaged. This was especially true in Orange County. The losses in central and western New York were not nearly so heavy. It was estimated that 236,000 (100-lb.) sacks were not harvested this season. In Western New York the quality was fairly good for the most part but in the central part of the State the quality was variable and some poor stock was harvested.

F.o.b. prices at western and central New York shipping points this season were generally lower throughout the greater part of this season than during the 1937-38 season. 50-lb. sacks of Yellows, U.S.No.1 stock, started to market at the beginning of the season in August at prices ranging from 50¢ to 55¢ and increased gradually until the last week in December when prices reached as high as \$1.00. During January and February, the price ranged from 75¢ to \$1.10, but during the month of March advanced to a range of 85¢ to \$1.33, mostly \$1.10 to \$1.27, and held that range until mid-April, when prices declined slightly.

The weekly carlot movement from the State did not reach 100 cars until the last week of August and held between 106 and 184 cars weekly until the end of December. From December until the end of the season shipments were less than 100 cars weekly. The peak movement from the State occurred during the week of September 24 to October 1 when 184 cars rolled from the State. Michigan furnished competition throughout the season and the rail movement from that State was greater for the season than from New York. Because of the nearness to the larger markets more of the onions produced in New York rolled via truck than from Michigan. Through April 29, Michigan moved 4,541 cars as compared with 4,072 from New York State. These two States last season through the same period moved 3,844 and 3,881 respectively. The movement from Texas started during the week March 25 to April 1 when 6 cars rolled from that State. Shipments increased rapidly and by the third week of April reached 950 cars.

In the past the acreage has been published on the equivalent basis of rows approximately 12 inches apart. For example, acreages planted with rows 36 inches apart were divided by 3 to derive the published acreage. Beginning with this report, plantings of Texas onions will be published on an actual acreage basis, regardless of the distance between rows. This will result in larger acreage figures and lower yields than were published formerly; however, the production level will be unchanged.
