PLANTED ACREAGE: The estimated amount of potatoes planted in Michigan for 1974, including the late summer and fall crops, was 43,700 acres. A total of 41,400 acres were reported for these two crops in 1973. In Bay County and vicinity, a total of 8,700 acres were used in 1974, compared with 8,400 acres in 1973. A total of 35,000 acres were utilized in Kent-Montcalm counties, and the Upper Peninsula in 1974, compared with 33,000 acres in 1973.

PRODUCTION: The estimated amount of Michigan potatoes harvested in 1974 were 42,400 acres. A total of 8,400 acres were in Bay County, and 34,000 were dug in Kent-Montcalm counties including the Upper Peninsula, Michigan. Yield per acre was up sharply at Bay County and vicinity, while showing only a slight increase at Kent-Montcalm counties and the Upper Peninsula. The average yield per acre for the late summer crop was 190 hundred weight, and 245 hundred weight for the fall crops of 1974.

The 1974 fall potato crop was estimated at a record 287.7 million hundred weight, 13 percent above 253.9 million hundred weight harvested in 1973. The 1974 crop was harvested from 1.14 million acres, 6 percent more than 1973. The United States average yield per acre was 253 hundred weight in 1974, and 238 hundred weight in 1973. The average yields were above a year earlier in the Eastern and Central states.

GROWING CONDITIONS: In Bay County, after a wet spring, weather conditions were mostly favorable reflecting the higher yields. Kent-Montcalm counties, however, conditions were not as favorable, but much improved over that of 1973.

HARVESTING: In the Bay County area light digging began in late July with most growers becoming active by early August. The fall crop harvest at Kent-Montcalm counties began in early September. Nearly all offerings from Bay County are shipped direct to fresh market outlets, while most offerings from the fall crop are put into storage.

MARKETING: Quality for the Bay County crop was good. In Kent-Montcalm counties some pressure bruising and excessive grade out was reported in the late storage offerings. The first market report covering the Bay County crop was released on Monday, July 22nd. Opening prices were sharply lower reflecting the heavier yields from all 1974 producing late summer states. Round Whites U.S.#1, size A 10 pound sacks loose sold at 63-66¢, compared with \$1.17 in 1973. During August prices declined even further, and reached 40¢ by August 23rd. Supplies from Bay County grew short in early September, and sufficient volume from Kent-Montcalm counties was not yet available. The temporary light supply situation created higher prices the week of September 9-13th, when 10 pound sacks reached 52¢. This price was the second highest during the season. Thereafter the market declined slowly, and reached a season low price of 37¢ on March, 14th. Light shipments of Round Whites continued into middle April, with light to moderate volume of Russetts moving from Upper Peninsula until middle May.

The Open Market chip price per hundred weight ranged from \$4.00 in December, to \$6.00 in early March. Good chipping quality potatoes were in peak demand most of the 1974-75 marketing season. The final report of the year was released on Monday, March 31st.

PACKAGE: The primary package for Round Whites was 10 and 20 pound sacks, with only limited volume of 50 pound sacks. An increasing amount of 8 and 15 pound sacks were reported shipped out of state. In previous years most of the 8 and 15 pound bags were shipped only to Chicago, and Detroit.

TRANSPORTATION: Trucks were the primary source of transportation to market. Michigan potato truck shipments reported for the 1974 crop through April 26th totaled 6,582 carlot equivalents, compared with 5,509 in 1973. The principal wholesale terminal markets selling Michigan potatoes were Detroit, Chicago, Atlanta, Cincinnati, Cleveland, and Pittsburgh.
