MARKETING WESTERN NEW YORK PEARS  
Brief Review of 1944 Season

Daily market reports on pears were issued from the Rochester office of the Federal State Market News Service from August 28 through November 2, 1944. This review is compiled from information contained in these daily reports and from data obtained from official publications of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets.

The United States pear crop in 1944 was estimated at 30,821,000 bushels by the Crop Reporting Board and was second only to the 1938 crop of 31,704,000 bushels and about 7 percent above the 10-year (1933-42) average. As usual the three States of Washington, Oregon, and California together produced between two-thirds and three-fourths of the crop. Because of the short crop last year east of the Rocky Mountains, those three States produced 84 percent of the total crop. The 1943 production for the country was estimated at 24,585,000 bushels.

In New York State, this year's crop was estimated at 1,157,000 bushels or more than double the light crop of 1943 when only 528,000 bushels were produced. The ten year (1933-42) average for the State was 1,117,000 bushels.

Pears blossomed from 4 to 10 days earlier this season than in the very late season of 1943, and 9 to 12 days later than in the very early year of 1942. Growing conditions were much better than a year ago. However, the wet weather during the early part of the season made insect and disease control difficult. The damage caused by the freezes of May 18 to 20 did some damage in some sections but the principal pear areas escaped serious damage.

All of the important varieties produced much heavier crops than a year ago. The percent of a full crop by varieties were as follows, 1944 season compared with 1943, Clapp Favorites 61 to 25, Bartletts 62 to 24, Seckels 57 to 31, Kieffers 64 to 30 and Boscs 51 to 26. The harvesting of the Clapp Favorites was about completed when the daily market reports started at Rochester, the Bartlett crop started about September 1 and was followed by Seckels around September 8 and Kieffers about October 10.

There was a serious shortage of labor at harvesting time and many prisoners of war, Jamaicans, and help from the South were employed in harvesting, packing, and canning the various crops.

F.o.b. prices at shipping point were somewhat lower than during the 1943 season. Bushel baskets of U.S.No.1, 2 inch minimum, Bartletts ranged from \$2.90-3.25 during the harvesting season and cold storage stock mostly from \$3.00-3.50, as compared with last season's prices of \$4.25-6.00 throughout the entire season. Seckels, U.S.No.1, 1½ inch minimum, ½ bushel baskets, ranged from \$1.75-2.15 this season compared with \$1.75-2.50 last season. As usual canners were active long before harvest time and contracted many Bartlett orchards at prices mostly around 4-5¢ per pound for 1 3/4 inch minimum with culls out and around 2¢ per pound for Kieffers. A large portion of the crop this season went to local and nearby canners but very little moved to the Canadian canners who ordinarily buy heavily in this section.

The rail movement from New York State this season was much heavier than a year ago, 351 cars had moved through February 1, 1945, as compared with only 119 cars for the 1943 season.
